## **3** CHAIR'S REPORT - ACHIEVEMENTS

- Four market days were held, including a Christmas Market on the 27<sup>th</sup> November 2021.
- A poetry reading evening was held as part of the Brockley Max festival on 2<sup>nd</sup> June 2021.
- A notice board was installed to help with communication of events and volunteer days at the garden.
- The Three Peaks Map was also installed at the garden. The printing and installation costs were covered by GTR as part of promoting the walking route from the station and the #RailDaysOut initiative, getting people to return to rail travel safely following covid restrictions.

- Project income of £1,281 relates to the deposit of the Three Peaks project money (partly transferred from the Neighbourhood Forum; and partly from ongoing map sales deposited as cash deposit. A £150 expense was made to update the main map that was installed at the garden, at Crofton Park station and as the Buckthorne Cutting Nature Reserve. Balance of £1,131.86 remains and is ring-fenced for the 3 Peaks Walk Project.
- Majority of income for the garden in 2021 relates to plant sales and market stall rentals on our market days, totalling £1,433.
- Donations from the general public amounted to £256.
- Remainder shown is actually a refund from the plant order due to no stock.



• The main expenditure for 2021 was the installation of a notice board as well as summer bulbs and compost.

## **5** GARDEN ISSUES


- Volunteer days did not resume in full; as a result the garden is in need of some maintenance.
   Responsibility for volunteer days needs to be spread amongst committee members to share burden and ensure they happen regularly.
- The station manager requested that we remove our compost bin. A number of reasons were given including smell near platform and that it was damaging fence. Photos showed that in fact the fence had always been slightly misaligned there. Nevertheless, they appointed contractors and have now removed it. We now need to build a bigger purpose-built one to replace this, and ensure it is hidden from the platform with a trellis, and has a lid, to avoid overfilling. An indicative quote was received from TCV (£1477.18 Inc. of VAT).
- Some noticeable damage to planting area caused by children playing; signage went up and seemed
  to make some difference, however some areas continue to be trampled, i.e area by station
  building. Current thinking is to convert this space into a space they can play in, to incorporate
  natural play elements like mud kitchen.

### **7** FUNDRAISING


In 2021 we applied to the following grant bids:

## 8 SUMMARY OF 2021 USER SURVEY

- 131 responded to November 2021 survey. Survey was run to primarily see what users wanted us to prioritise in terms of enhancements or improvements. The key themes from the previous survey were extracted and formed basis of categories.
- 46% wanted to see kids natural play. This wasn't too surprising given the majority of respondents say they visit with children 67%.
- More wildlife enhancements was the next priority with 22% choosing this, followed by more seating (15%) and more planting (10%).
- Many lovely comments about how it is a much loved garden and how it provided an important green space during the pandemic.



## 9 FORWARD PLAN FOR 2022

- Improving the garden for kids play; depending on fund availably, prioritise different areas as per plan put together by Hugo.
- Lewisham Cultural fund bid to have activities at the garden in the summer. Covid permitting, maybe have an anniversary celebration at the start of June to mark the 3<sup>rd</sup> year of opening.
- Complete the GTR funding call. Only offering groups £200.
- Build composter
- Get more quotes for irrigation system
- Diversify funding strategy
- Update funding page with plans, upload kids play presentation and initiate crowdfunding.
